

Dear Partner in School Safety,

Safe2Tell is a state funded resource that is available to all Colorado communities and schools at all times as a means to anonymously report safety concerns of youth and adults. Safe2Tell provides students and adults an increased ability to both prevent and report violence and other concerning behaviors in a way that keeps them safe. The Safe2Tell model works to break the code of silence by educating, empowering, equipping and engaging students to be a part of the solution. Students use Safe2Tell to report: bullying, suicide concerns, depression, sexting, stealing, threats, cutting, abuse, dating and domestic violence, fights, drugs, alcohol, weapons or other types of dangerous situations that threaten their safety or the safety of others for the purpose of prevention through effective interventions.

Research shows that students who do not feel safe at school will not succeed academically. Your role as a Colorado educator or officer of the law is vitally important in creating a culture and climate of respect in Colorado schools and communities. Safe2Tell is here to support your efforts in creating safer schools by providing you with the tools to educate and empower your students to report their concerns to caring, committed adults and anonymously to Safe2Tell.

The Safe2Tell Student Education Toolkit is designed to provide an overview to Colorado students, by appropriate age level, the importance of reporting concerns and how the Safe2Tell program works. The Toolkits are available at no costs to Colorado schools and communities to equip teachers, school staff, SROs, law enforcement and community program leaders to effectively educate children and youth on the Safe2Tell message.
