


Data2Report November 2015

Our latest results and data measures showcasing Safe2Tell CO reports received in November 2015 are highlighted in our Data2Report infographic.

In November 2015:

- A total of **600** reports were received; this number represents double the number of reports received in November 2014.
- The mobile app (40%) continues to be the number one method for making Safe2Tell reports.
- **Bullying, Suicide Concerns and Drugs/Alcohol** are the top three most reported concerns to Safe2Tell CO.


